

BYLAW 492-19

A BYLAW OF THE TOWN OF CARNDUFF TO PROVIDE REGULATIONS FOR ROUTES, STORAGE, STOPPING, PARKING, AND THE DELIVERY OF DANGEROUS GOODS.

The Council of the Town of Carnduff in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

1. This Bylaw shall be known and may be cited as “The Transportation of Dangerous Goods Bylaw, 2019” of the Town of Carnduff.
2. The purpose of this bylaw is:
 - To designate routes for the transportation of dangerous goods in the Town of Carnduff.
 - To regulate storage, stopping, and parking of vehicles used in the transportation of dangerous goods.
 - To regulate the delivery of dangerous goods.
3. The definition is:
Dangerous Goods – any product, substance, or organism included by its nature or by the regulations in any of the classes listed in this schedule.

Classes of Dangerous Goods	
Class 1	Explosives, including explosives within the meaning of <i>The Explosives Act</i> .
Class 2	Gases; compressed, deeply refrigerated, liquefied or dissolved under pressure.
Class 3	Flammable and combustible liquids.
Class 4	Flammable solids; substances liable to spontaneous combustion; substances that on contact with water emit flammable gases.
Class 5	Oxidizing substances; organic peroxides.
Class 6	Poisonous (toxic) and infectious substances.
Class 7	Radioactive materials and radioactive prescribed substances within the meaning of <i>The Atomic Energy Control Act</i> .
Class 8	Corrosives
Class 9	Miscellaneous products, substances or organisms considered by the Governor-in-Council to be dangerous to life, health, property, or the environment when handled, offered for transport or transported and prescribed to be included in this class.

4. Conditions of this Bylaw shall include:
 - 1) The streets set out in Schedule “A” to this bylaw are hereby established as dangerous goods transportation routes.
 - 2) No person shall operate a vehicle transporting or designed for transporting dangerous goods in bulk other than on a dangerous goods route (marked in yellow on Schedule “A”), **except while such vehicle:**
 - i. Is loading or unloading goods. When it is necessary to deviate from a dangerous goods route to load or unload goods at a point on or off a route, the person operating that vehicle will leave and return to the dangerous goods route by the most direct route to the closest point on the dangerous goods route.
 - 3) No person transporting any dangerous goods through the Town of Carnduff shall stop **except:**
 - i. At a permitted storage location or permitted commercial site
 - ii. To load or unload goods as per previous Section (2)(i)
 - iii. To comply with a traffic control device or at the direction of a peace officer
 - iv. Due to mechanical failure of the vehicle transporting the dangerous goods or a motor vehicle accident involving the carrier vehicle
 - v. To obtain fuel for the carrier vehicle or carry out emergency repairs
 - vi. While travelling on “Railway Avenue” to eat at a restaurant or purchase goods from a vendor.
 - vii. To park overnight at:
 - The Coop Card-lock
 - The Race Track Gas
 - The former Elementary School parking lot
 - The vacant lots between CN tracks and Railway Avenue between 3rd Street West and Broadway Avenue
 - The westbound lane of Railway Avenue

- 4) The above does not apply to:
- i. The transportation of dangerous goods, with a weight measure of less than 450 kg or a liquid measure of 450 litres, not transported in a power unit or semi;
 - ii. Fuel in the fuel tanks of vehicles transporting the dangerous goods, where the tanks are designed by the manufacturer for the primary operation of the vehicle and the tanks have permanent lines to the fuel system of the vehicle.

5. Enforcement of Bylaw:

The Council of the Town of Carnduff may appoint any bylaw enforcement officer it desires, at any time.

Any entity or person found to be violating this bylaw, may be liable to a two thousand (\$2,000) dollar fine as per Bylaw No. 335/98 General Penalty Bylaw.

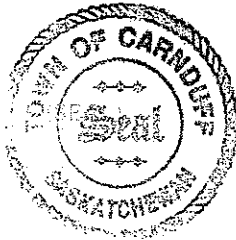
Council reserves the right to ban any entity or person found to be violating this bylaw, from transporting dangerous goods through the Town of Carnduff.


6. Provisions Not Described:

Any transportation of dangerous goods requirement not described in this bylaw, must be followed according to any applicable Act or Regulation prescribed between the agreement between the Minister of Highways and Transportation, Government of Saskatchewan and the Minister of Transport, Government of Canada. The Council may adjourn any such appeal to any subsequent meeting from time to time.

7. This bylaw shall come into effect on the date of passing.

8. Bylaw No. 287 shall be hereby repealed.
