Do you have house or building numbers located on your home or place of business? House or building numbers are very important when it comes to emergency situations. Without a house or building number emergency service personnel may not be able to locate you in an emergency situation. We

proper signage indicating your civic address number.

The Town is doing our part in ensuring our public facilities are also

clearly marked. In 2019 we will ensure all of our public buildings have proper signage.

### **OUTDOOR FIREPITS**

It's that time of year and we would like to remind residents of a few things regarding outdoor fire pits.

All fire pits are to be covered with a metal screen, located on private property at least 10 feet from any property line, building or other combustible structure. They must also be separated from grass or any other vegetation by a distance of at least 16 inches. See bylaw #449-13 for more info.

### **STRAY CATS**

We have received a number of complaints regarding stray cats on private property. We would like to ask residents to please be courteous of neighbours and ensure cats are properly looked after.

If you are having trouble with stray cats on your property, the Town of

Carnduff has a trap we can provide to residents to trap the cats. Once trapped, they will be held for 72 hrs.

Pictures of the cat will be posted on our website (www.carnduff.ca) under news, on our Facebook Page and in the lobby of the Town Office. If the cat is NOT claimed within 72 hours, we will do our best to place the cat in a new home. Whomever the cat belongs to will be responsible for all boarding and/or care charges prior to its release.
