
We are nearing the tender stage for Phase 2 of our project.



## DID YOU KNOW..... ABOUT FENCES

Do I need a permit for a fence? Yes, you require a development permit for the construction of a fence. Applications can be found online or you can stop by the office and pick one up! (Note: A development permit is different than a building permit. A

than a building development permit ensures all zoning requirements are being met, etc. A building permit



ensures all building meets National Building Code standards and are reviewed and inspected by a building official).

For residential fences, the maximum height requirements are:

- \* 3 feet above grade level in a front yard
- \* 6 feet above grade level in a rear yard
- Note: this may differ on a corner lot where site triangles need to be taken into consideration.

# DID YOU KNOW..... ABOUT RESIDENTIAL SWIMMING POOLS

By definition in our Zoning Bylaw, a swimming pool is any body of water permanently

outdoors or indoors, contained by artificial means and used and maintained for the purpose of swimming, wading, or diving and having a depth of 2 ft or more at any point.

Our Zoning Bylaw has the following requirements for a swimming pool:

- \* No part of such pool is located closer to any lot or street line than the minimum distance required for the principal building located on such lot.
- \* The maximum height of such pool is 4 ft above the average finished grade level of the ground adjoining the pool and to within 15 ft of such pool.
- \* Every swimming pool shall be enclosed by a non-climbable and lockable fence of at least 6ft in height and no more than 10 cm from the ground, and located at a distance not less than 5 ft from the pool.
- \* Any deck attached to or abutting a swimming pool shall be considered as part of the swimming pool

# DID YOU KNOW ..... YOU CAN CHECK YOUR OWN WATER METER

The town reads the water meters every three months for billing purposes. At this time we are also able to do a leak report of properties with leaks. We want to ensure residents know they can check for a leak at any time themselves. To do this, open the black cover on the water meter and shine a bright light on the sensor. Once the meter loads up, it will show some numbers. These numbers are the actual meter reading. If you have a continuous leak, there will also be a solid picture of a leaking tap. If you have an intermittent leak, it will flash the same picture of the dripping leak. If you have a leak and have fixed it, give the meter 24 hours to clear the leak as it needs to run a 24 hr cycle to clear if the leak has stopped.
