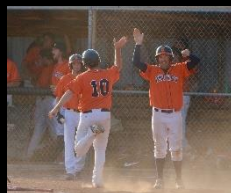
LOCAL ORGANIZATION:

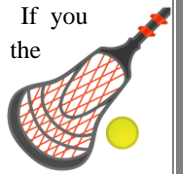

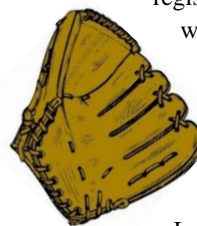

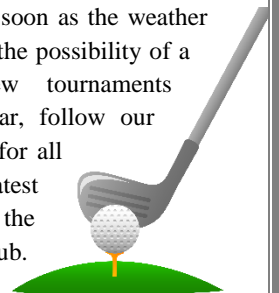

VANDALISM TO OUR RADAR SPEED SIGNS

We are requesting the publics help. The Town had two radar speed signs. One was located on Railway Avenue between the Municipal Services Office and 4th Street West and the second was located along the Super Grid. These were to assist with slowing traffic down to ensure pedestrian and resident safety.

Sometime during the evening hours between April 8th and 9th the one on Railway Avenue was extensively damaged. Then the following week during the evening hours of April 14th and 15th the one along the Super Grid was also severely damaged. At this point the signs have not been able to be repaired.



We are very disappointed in these two incidents. The signs cost roughly \$11,000 two years ago. We were fortunate to receive some grant funding towards the purchase of them however that doesn't make it any less of a loss.

 Effective July 1, 2022 **ALL** buildings with a residential occupancy are required to install a carbon monoxide alarm and a smoke alarm (or a device which detects both carbon monoxide and smoke).
