SNOW REMOVAL

Yes, we said it! The dreaded, to many, “S” word! In preparation for snow removal efforts by everyone there are a few things we wanted to remind everyone about! These reminders will hopefully help ensure a safe and efficient snow removal season by our public works staff.



The order of snow removal of our streets always starts with emergency routes, followed by main thorough ways and finished with remaining residential streets.

Parked vehicles, garbage and recycling bins can all create a nuisance when it comes to snow removal as they can be hard to maneuver around, especially in large snow falls. Please ensure bins and vehicles are removed in a timely manner.

If your completing snow removal on your property, please remember the snow coming from your property must stay on your property.



Snow is NOT to be pushed to ditches,

boulevards, the street or other properties. There are many reasons for this. Sometimes excess snow pushed to these areas can cause sight line challenges for traffic, it can cause drainage issues in the spring and depending on the amount of snow can cause challenges for our own snow removal efforts of streets.

At times you may notice a ridge left at the end of your driveway.



Our public works staff works hard to try to ensure this does not happen but sometimes it does. One reason it may happen is if we are having mechanical issues with our grader and the snow is wet and heavy it can be too heavy for the wing to carry it. If you have a rather wide driveway or if you and your neighbours driveway

UPDATE

We are still in the seeding process stage for the bio-filtration system. There have been some challenges as we work through this process. The length of time it will take depends on the response of the filters. Once they are fully functioning, they will be brought online. At that time, we will be sure to notify all our residents of the transition!

Council has also given the approval to apply under the latest round of infrastructure funding through the Federal and Provincial government called the ICIP program (Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program). This program is currently accepting applications for water projects. We will be applying for the final stage of upgrades at the water treatment plant which is a membrane filtration system.
