ASSESSMENT ROLL OPEN

Notice is hereby given that the assessment roll for the Town of Camduff for the year of 2023 has been prepared and is open to inspection in the office of the assessor from 9:00 a.m. to noon and 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. on the following days

Monday to Friday, March 16, 2023 to April 17, 2023.

A bylaw pursuant to section 214 of *The Municipalities Act* has been passed and the assessment notices have been sent as required.


