As we embark on the 118<sup>th</sup> year of Carnduff as a Town, we thought it would be fun to reflect on Carnduff throughout the years!

**Incorporation & Population**

Carnduff was incorporated in 1905 as a town. Prior to that Carnduff had settled west of the current location about a mile and a half in 1882 until 1891 when it was moved to the current location. In 1899 the hamlet gained village status. An interesting statistic is in 1911, 6 years after becoming a Town, the population was 469 people. In 2021, our statistics Canada population is 1150.

**Utilities**

The first telephone system came to Carnduff in 1906 with 4 phones. Sewer lines were installed in 1957 with water lines to follow in 1959. In 1963 mercury vapour street lights were installed. The same year natural gas for heating was brought to town replacing coal and oil furnaces. Paving was completed in 1977 under a Neighbourhood Improvement Grant from the Provincial and Federal Governments.

**Schools**

In 1892 the first school was built in Town, followed by a two-story brick school opened in 1906 which was destroyed by fire in 1950. In 1952 a new school was opened and continued to house both elementary and high school students which underwent an 8-classroom addition in 1956 and is now owned by True Integrity Developers. In 1962 an additional school, which became Carnduff High School was built. This location is now the Dean Fraser Community Centre. In the fall of 2004, the Carnduff Education Complex opened its door as our new Kindergarten to Grade 12 school, which has since added the Pre-Kindergarten program. Hard to believe it is currently in its 18<sup>th</sup> school year.

**R.C.M.P**

The Carnduff detachment of the Royal North West Mounted Police was opened in 1905 but closed and moved to the Goshen district in 1916. In 1928 R.C.M.P obtained the provincial contract to police the province and re-opened the Carnduff detachment, servicing the community and area since.

We would like to take a moment to acknowledge our Local Volunteer Fire Department and all they do for our community! They recently had a number of members receive long-term service awards. Congratulations!

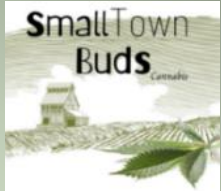
