LANFDILL HOURS

FLORAL PLANTERS

The floral planter program will once again be a part of our



beautification plans for 2018.

All planters are uniform in size and will have a sign depicting the sponsor and/or message. Example: "In Memory of a Loved One" or "Sponsored by the Happy Family".

Planters are \$150 for the first year. This includes the cost for the sign. Each subsequent year they are \$100 per year and are invoiced each spring.

LAGOON PROGRESS UPDATE

The spring construction season is upon us and with that construction at our lagoon will resume after a short winter shut-down.

Crews will be finishing up screening sand for the project.
Once the

weather warms they will then begin laying the



liner for the interior of the cells.

Currently we are in the process of finalizing plans for the two lift stations. This includes work to the existing station located on 4th Street East and plans for the new

lift station that will be located just east of Anniversary Bay.

To date project costs incurred are



\$3,100,042.33. Of this we have received 2/3 funding from the Province of Saskatchewan and Federal

Government. The Town's portion being \$1,033.347.44. The project to date has remained on budget and we are confident it will continue this way.

OUTDOOR FIREPITS

Campfire season is just around the corner and with that we would like to remind residents of a few things.

All fire pits are to be covered with a metal screen, located on private property at least 10 feet from any property line, building or other combustible structure. They must also be separated from grass or any other vegetation by a distance of at least 16 inches.
