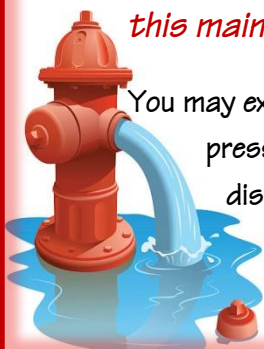
LAGOON PROGRESS UPDATE

NOTIFICATION SYSTEM

By now more residents are aware of the Everbridge Notification system.



This is the system the Town and R.M. utilize to notify residents about emergency situations or other important matters.

As we utilize the system more, we are becoming more aware of the administrative side of the system and how things work. We would like to ask residents to PLEASE confirm when they receive a message. We ask this for two reasons.

ONE – once you confirm the message, the system is to stop trying to contact you. Example: If you have your first choice of contact by text to your cell phone and your second choice of contact your home phone, the system will first text you and if you do not confirm, it will continue trying to reach you at your home phone. By confirming you have received the message by text, the system should not be phoning your home phone.

TWO – in a high priority situation (ie: boil water advisory or emergent evacuation order), administration will utilize the reports to confirm who has received the message and how has not. Using the boil water advisory as an example, if we send a message that your residence is on a boil water advisory and you do not confirm you have received it,

administration must then hand deliver the notice or tape it to your door. By confirming you receive the message, it saves time and cost. Using the emergent evacuation example, if there was a mandatory evacuation and you received the message and do not confirm, we then have to send our emergency service personnel into a potentially dangerous situation unnecessarily.

If you are unsure if you are receiving the messages or if we have your current information, please



contact the office at 306-482-3300 and we would be happy to check. We are continually performing maintenance to the contacts to try to keep the database up to date however we require residents to contact us if their information changes.
