SNOW REMOVAL

We would like to remind residents to please remember to remove parked vehicles from the streets to ensure they can be cleared of snow. We would also like to ask residents to please remove garbage or recycling bins from the curb as soon as convenient in order to ensure snow to be cleared more efficiently.

The Town of Carnduff snow removal priority list is as follows:

- Emergency routes for ambulance, fire and police
- Business district, school, public utility accesses
- Residential Streets
- Commercial and Industrial Streets
- Back alleys

With a snow fall like that comes many challenges and we thank you for your patience as we work to ensure everything is again opened up. Our town maintenance staff will only be opening the back alleys which are utilized. Once again, we would like to remind residents when moving snow, to ensure it stays on your property and is not pushed to neighbouring properties or to municipal boulevards and streets. We understand there is a lot of snow and people are running out of places to put it but we ask that you please be mindful of this.

Our staff try their best to clear the roads in an effective and efficient manner without leaving anyone with blocked driveways however this can happen from time to time or in extreme circumstances. (The arm on the grader could not be used following the Christmas Day snow fall as there was too much snow and it would have broke the arm). We thank you in advance for your patience and cooperation of snow removal efforts.

FIRE DEPARTMENT FALSE ALARMS

The Town of Carnduff would like to remind residents about the importance of eliminating false alarm call outs of our emergency services. The R.M. of Mount Pleasant No. 2 and Town of Carnduff Volunteer Fire Department has seen a substantial increase in the number of false alarm calls they have received throughout the past year.

Did you know?
Each time the fire department is called out on a call, including false alarms, they are out of service. That means that if there is another emergency they cannot attend.

NOTIFICATION SYSTEM

The Town still utilizes the Everbridge Emergency Notification system. This system is used to notify residents in emergency situations. It is also used to notify residents of water shut-off & repairs, fire bins, snow removal efforts and any other situations that may be of value to you.

If you have not signed up for this



system, we ask that you please do so as soon as possible. You can stop by the Town Office and provide the information or

you can sign-up yourself on our Town website. Simply visit www.carnduff.ca and the link can be found under About/Emergency Services.

The system allows you to choose your preferred method of contact from text to voice call to email. It also allows you to choose more than one contact method.

On February 21, 2017 we will be sending out a User Test Notification to all residents we have information for. If you do not receive this notification or would like to change your method of receiving them, please contact our office.

NEW WATER METERS

The majority of the new water meters have now been installed. There have been many questions about how the meters work. In November, we

mailed out an information sheet with details on how to read your meter and information on how your meter works. To view a copy of that information, it can be found on our website www.carnduff.ca Municipal Services/Newsletters Waterworks. In addition to this information we would like to note you need to use a strong light to shine on the meter to read it, a faint or dull light will not work.

UTILITY BILL PAYMENTS

The Town has always issued utility bills quarterly and at this time will continue to do so. If residents would prefer to make monthly payments on



their utility account, you are more than welcome to do so. Payments can be

made with online banking through the Bank of Montreal or Credit Union, cheque, cash or debit.

In 2017 we will be moving forward with email billing. We look forward to being able to offer bills this way and it will assist with cost savings. If you would like to receive your bills via email, please ensure we have your email information.
