## NOTIFICATION SYSTEM

In the last newsletter we stated that we would be doing a mass test notification in February. We would like to apologize for not following through on this. The new date for the mass test notification is set for Friday, April 28<sup>th</sup>. On March 3<sup>rd</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> there was a notification sent out to all town residents regarding a possible water service disruption. If you did not receive those notifications, please contact the office so that we can be sure to get your information added to the system. If you received the message but would like to change the way your received it, please contact the office and we will be sure to get your delivery preferences changed.

*We would also like to remind people to please CONFIRM once you have received the message.* If there has been a voice mail message left for you, it will ask you to call a number to confirm and give you a pin number to use. This is safe to do and is part of the system.

## 2017 PROPERTY ASSESSMENT

2017 is a property re-assessment year for the entire province, which is called revaluation year. In addition to the revaluation, the Town had a residential re-assessment of all properties completed in 2016 that will reflect on the 2017 assessment values. This brings the residential assessment number current and consistent for everyone. Property owners will see a large increase to their assessment. The land has increased in value on all properties.

Assessment notices have been mailed out to all property owners. We



encourage you to review your assessment notice and ensure it is correct. Property owners will have 60 days from the date assessment notices are mailed to address any concerns they have.

The question many residents have is, how will this affect my taxes? Through the budgeting process, council determines what level of funds the municipality requires to operate. Once that is completed and grant funds are accounted for, the amount of revenue needed from taxes is determined. That value is then used to calculate how much taxes will be. Council will set the mill rate and any other tax tools that are applied. *Your assessment may have doubled but that does not mean your taxes will double!*
